### **Head lice**

We have already had a number of confirmed cases of head lice. This is an on going frustration for parents and requires every family to work together to keep this nuisance at bay. Please check your child's hair at least once a week. If your child has been affected they will require treatment over several weeks. One off treatment is not enough due to the lifecycle of the head lice. If a child is suspected of having head lice a text will be sent to the child's family. If they are still not treated then a letter will follow the next week with further guidance.

You can help prevent the spread of head lice by keeping your child's hair tied up neatly whilst at school. If you require further guidance please talk to your child's class teacher or Mrs Cook.

Please note that absence from school due to head lice will not be authorised.
