The Sensory Garden Project – Please Help!

In the summer term the PTFA raised £500 from a generous donation from the Rotary Club of Folkestone. The Infant's playground is in need of modernisation and plans are underway for a sensory garden around the coloured planters and under the trees at the back of the playground.

This would be a tactile and fragrant garden to stimulate children's senses of sight, touch, taste and hearing, so would include a seating area, wind chimes, herbs and plants and new paint for the planters. Children could use this area for fun and play, outdoor learning, nature lessons, quiet time or gardening.
